Mdm Emelyn Soon is a caring and dedicated Lead Teacher in CHIJ Kellock. She believes in the importance of nurturing the social-emotional growth and character of the young, as well as equipping them with 21st century competencies to thrive in a fast-changing and highly-connected world.

Mdm Soon recognises the importance of developing pupils who are not only concerned citizens with a strong sense of civic responsibility but who are also keen contributors who take on an active role in improving the lives of others around them. Beyond the school level, she involved pupils in performing a prize-winning skit for the 'Children for Children' @ Flyer programme in 2008 to reach out to 1000 underprivileged children on Children's Day. The pupil volunteers reflected that their involvement gave them a sense of pride and achievement as they were able to contribute to the community by educating the public on crime prevention.

Mdm Soon uses a wide repertoire of teaching strategies to develop her pupils' interest in learning. These strategies include the use of songs, role-play and co-operative learning in her class.

A strong believer in growing and mentoring teachers, Mdm Soon designed and demonstrated how to meaningfully infuse Social Emotional Learning (SEL) competencies into her pastoral care lessons. The SEL lesson, which she had developed for her Primary 6 pupils, was filmed and used in training teachers in her cluster as a model lesson. The teachers benefitted from watching the video of her SEL lesson as they were able to plan good pastoral care lessons to impact a greater number of pupils.

Mdm Soon's commitment to teaching and learning and her deep care and concern for her pupils' development make her a truly inspiring teacher.

Mr Devindra Sapai is the Dean of Pupil Development in Seng Kang Primary School. He cares passionately about the character and moral development of all his pupils and plays a key role in ensuring that the teaching of values is embedded across all disciplines.

Mr Devindra was instrumental in starting the Daily Physical Education (PE) Programme in 2008. Enhancements in assessment, new skills development and social-emotional learning competencies were infused into the PE lesson. The Daily PE Programme received endorsement from MOE and has been shared with many local institutions, such as schools, the National Institute of Education and Singapore Sports School, as well as with foreign delegates.
