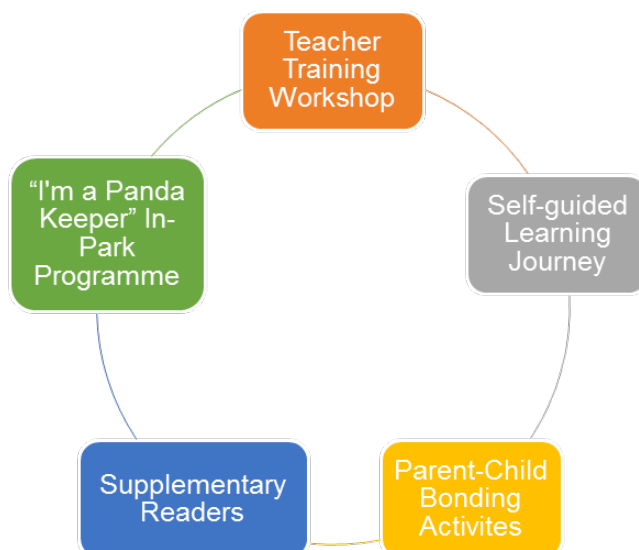


Information on the *Wow Wild Learn* Programme

There were 60 pre-schools which participated in its pilot roll-out in 2016, where about 220 teachers and 1,960 pre-school children as well as their parents benefitted from the programme. It comprises 5 components, as illustrated below:



Teacher Training Workshop

A one-day session for teachers will be conducted at the River Safari to equip them with the required pedagogical knowledge on developing effective lesson plans and useful teaching strategies on experiential learning to conduct the learning journey at the River Safari.

“I’m a Panda Keeper” In-Park Programme

Wildlife Reserves Singapore conducts an interactive programme for the pre-school children, which takes about 1 hour, for them to learn about the pandas. The children will learn about things like the pandas’ diet and their daily habits. This takes place before the pre-school children embark on the learning journey.

Self-guided Learning Journey

After the in-park programme, the pre-school teachers will lead their students on the learning journey to the River Safari. The teachers will facilitate this independently, without involvement from Wildlife Reserves Singapore, as they would have been trained during the workshop earlier.

Supplementary Readers

CPCLL will also sponsor two supplementary readers on related topics to every participating child. Teachers will use the supplementary readers as teaching material to engage their students during Chinese language lessons. Parents are also encouraged to make use of the supplementary readers to learn with their children.

Parent-Child Bonding Activities

Teachers will design parent-child activities so that students are able to involve their families in their learning journey, such as parent-child performance in Mother Tongue Language and the making of “Panda sushi”.
