DETAILS ABOUT THE VARIOUS START SCHEMES AND 2018 RECIPIENTS

A. Ministry of Education – Autonomous University (MOE-AU) Scholarship

The MOE-AU scholarship provides support at the undergraduate level, to help prepare recipients for future academic careers.

MOE-AU scholarship recipients are paired with a specific AU upon receipt of the scholarship, and scholars can express their preferences to be paired with a specific AU in their applications. Currently, MOE-AU scholarship recipients may be paired with NUS, NTU, SMU or SUTD.

The MOE-AU Scholarship sponsors recipients for up to four years of undergraduate studies, after which the scholar is expected to apply for and obtain an AU-sponsored postgraduate scholarship to pursue a PhD.

B. Overseas PhD Scholarship

The Overseas PhD Scholarship supports Singaporeans who have been accepted for doctoral training at a leading overseas/local academic/research institution. The scholarship provides support for up to five years in terms of stipends/salaries, overseas maintenance allowances, conference and fieldwork grants, airfares and other compulsory fees depending on the scholar's institution of study. Upon receipt of the scholarship, scholars will be paired with a local AU. MOE funds 50% of the scholarship while the paired university funds the other 50%. Scholars will return to their paired university as faculty members upon completion of their doctoral training to serve their bond.

C. Overseas Post-Doctoral Fellowship

The Post-Doctoral Fellowship supports Singaporeans who have just been conferred a doctoral degree and have been accepted for postdoctoral training at a leading overseas/local academic/research institution. The Scholarship provides support for up to two years in terms of stipends/salaries, overseas maintenance allowances, conference and fieldwork grants, airfares and other compulsory fees depending on the scholar's institution of study. MOE funds 50% of the fellowship while the paired university funds the other 50%. Scholars will return to their paired university as faculty members upon completion of their post-doctoral training to serve their bond.

D. Early Career Awards

The Early Career Award supports Singaporeans who have completed their PhD and/or post-doctoral training, but have yet to be appointed to the tenure track in the

Singapore AUs. Recipients of such awards will be expected to teach and conduct research, with the objective of helping them establish a competitive portfolio for consideration for appointment on the tenure-track at the AU thereafter. The award provides support for up to three years in terms of salaries/stipends and research grants. MOE funds 50% of the award while the paired university funds the other 50%. Scholars will return to their paired university as faculty members upon completion of their period of award to serve their bond.
