The AY2019 fees for NUS Medicine/Dentistry and NTU Medicine are \$28,900 and \$34,700 respectively. In addition to enhancements across the board to cover a higher proportion of fees for Medicine and Dentistry undergraduates, MOE will also differentiate the bursaries for NUS and NTU such that after receipt of the bursary, undergraduates enrolled in both NUS and NTU will have the same remaining fee to be paid if the maximum bursary amount is used to offset fees. As an example, for a NUS or NTU Medicine student who qualifies for the highest bursary tier, the remaining tuition fee payable will be \$10,000 per annum, after the enhanced government bursary. When combined with the additional aid from the university, he will pay no more than \$5,000 per annum in tuition fees.
