About the Social Science Research Thematic Grant Call (SSRTG)

The SSRTG aims to boost research in areas of strategic relevance to Singapore and the Asian region and provides three tiers of funding for supported projects:

- Type A (S\$100,000 to S\$1 million for up to 3 years per project): This aims to support smaller-scale, investigator-led research in areas of strategic relevance.
- Type B (>S\$1 million to S\$5 million over 3 to 5 years per project)
- Type C (>\$5 million to \$10 million over 3 to 5 years per project): Both Type B and Type C aim to support research programmes that are more ambitious, inter-disciplinary and focus on issues of cross-cutting interest.
