

Highlights of Pre-University Seminar 2022

- *Pre-Seminar Workshop and Research Dialogues (March – May)*

All participants attended a half-day online workshop in March where they met fellow group members, explored the seminar's theme and narratives, and decided on their groups' strategic areas of focus. In the following months, participants also had the opportunity to speak to resource persons such as academics and representatives from the public, private and people sectors to deepen their understanding of their chosen topic.

- *Opening Ceremony (31 May)*

Minister for Education Mr Chan Chun Sing was the Guest-of-Honour for the Opening Ceremony. Following his opening address, participants interacted with him in a Question & Answer session.

- *Learning Journeys - 'Leverage with Sensitivity' (31 May)*

Participants will embark on learning journeys to be inspired by the various ways in which the four narratives can be actualised. Some examples of the places to be visited include City Sprouts Singapore, Housing Development Board's LIVINGSPACE Gallery, and Fullerton Hotel. The visits will deepen participants' understanding of the broader national landscape, enabling them to better contextualise the four narratives.

- *Panel Discussions - 'Leverage with Sensitivity' (1 June)*

There will be panel discussions aligned with the four narratives. Panellists with different areas of expertise will share their knowledge and experience, and exchange ideas with participants.

- *Narrative and Cross Narrative Discussions - 'Lead with Creativity' (1 - 2 June)*

All participant groups within each narrative will meet on Day 2 of the seminar to reflect on and share their learning from the Learning Journeys to facilitate the exchange of perspectives.

Participant groups will then meet groups from other narratives on Day 3 of the seminar to reflect on and share their learning from the Panel Discussions held on Day 2.

- *Exhibition and Closing Ceremony (3 June)*

Minister of State for Culture, Community and Youth, and Trade and Industry, Mr Alvin Tan, will be the Guest-of-Honour at the Closing Ceremony on 3 June, where he will deliver closing remarks. He will also tour the Closing Ceremony Exhibition where participants, as young people who play an important role in the Singapore Story, will showcase what they have collectively learnt about service and envisioned for Singapore.
