RELEASE OF PRIMARY SCHOOL LEAVING EXMINATION (PSLE) RESULTS 2023

1. How does the performance of the 2023 PSLE cohort compare with that of last year's cohort?

98.4% of Primary 6 students this year are assessed to be suitable for progression to secondary school, which is comparable to last year and past Primary 6 cohorts.

2. What proportion of students are eligible for Posting Group 1, 2 and 3 respectively? How does this compare to the proportion of students who were eligible for Normal (Technical) [N(T)], Normal (Academic) [N(A)], and Express courses respectively last year?

The PSLE score ranges for the three posting groups are mapped from the existing courses, and the proportion of students eligible for Posting Group 1, 2 and 3 are comparable to the proportion of students last year who were eligible for the N(T), N(A) and Express courses respectively.

3. Why is MOE not releasing statistics on the eligibility for Posting Groups 1, 2 and 3, when MOE has shared statistics on the percentage of candidates who were assessed suitable for the N(T), N(A) and Express courses in previous years?

Unlike the previous streaming system, Posting Groups are only used to facilitate students' entry into secondary school and guide the initial subject levels that they can take at the start of Secondary One. Under Full-Subject-Based Banding, students will have opportunities to adjust their subject levels, depending on their strengths, interests, and learning needs, at different points throughout their secondary school journey. As such, MOE will not be issuing Posting Group eligibility-related statistics moving forward, as it would no longer be meaningful to do so.
