What Do Students Learn In Family Education?

Through Family Education lessons, students learn:

 To demonstrate love, care and concern, and respect, for their family members through acts of kindness and words of care







 To appreciate that responsibilities such as care-giving, household chores and generating income differ from family to family*, and can be shared

 To appreciate their parents and family members as all play important roles in shaping their growth and development, and helping them to become their best selves



^{*}Families take different forms, with members or guardian playing different roles, such as both parents or a grandparent as the main caregiver, or single-parent families, foster or adoptive families, and families with step-parents.
