¹ The government bursary amount for the undergraduates of NUS Medicine/Dentistry and NTU Medicine courses are differentiated by institution and intake year. After the receipt of the bursary, undergraduates enrolled in both NUS and NTU will pay the same remaining fee if the maximum bursary amount has been used to offset the fees.

With a combination of government bursary and additional aid from the university, an NUS or NTU Medicine/Dentistry student who qualifies for the highest bursary tier will pay no more than \$5,000 per year in tuition fees.
